Enjoy learning about how the Indians and early pioneers/settlers farmed and lived in nearby Tazewell. We will tour an 1800 cabin kitchen garden and dyers garden to see the vegetables and medicinal herbs that would be grown and cared for by the women in the family. Interpreters will be available to explain and demonstrate the process of dying and weaving flax and wool and show how baskets were made using reeds from the Clinch River. Enjoy a buffet lunch in the air conditioned Red Barn. After lunch, the cabins and gallery will be open for individual tours either guided or on your own. Expect to be back in Blacksburg by 4 PM and Roanoke by 5 PM.
